Everything In Between

I told a story last Sunday about what many refer to as a "God nudge" or a "Holy Spirit nudge." It refers to a time when we get a clear message in our heart or our head to do something or change something. Whether the message is one we hoped for or not, it is a really good thing to simply get an answer – a clear direction - when so often things are unclear and confusing, and we do not know what to do. Perhaps you, like me, long for an easy answer at least some of the time, clear direction, a clear yes or no. Too often we are stuck somewhere in the middle, where things are murky and uncertain. This realization of our common condition is the perfect environment for the season of Lent.

Lent is a time of turning, a reflection on the ways that we too often turn away from God and the realization that in spite of our waywardness and unrepentant thoughts, feelings, and actions, God is always turning towards us. God meets us in the murky, messy middle of our lives. That is what our theme this Lenten season is all about. Things are rarely black and white, this or that, either/or, but something in between. If you often feel caught in the middle, if you wonder what Christianity and Jesus have to say about the complexities of not fitting into any neat categories, this season will be a great time for you to be engaged with this community in study and worship and prayer.

Aleksandr Solzhenitsyn said, "The line separating good and evil passes not through states, nor between classes, nor between political parties either – but right through every human heart." Lent is a time to search our hearts for what is not of God and to turn back to the God who is always running after us. We find God most often in the spaces between us. Lent is not only about our relationship with God, but our relationships with one another. A prayer out of the Disciples of Christ Church says, "And I have come to see the space between you and me as nothing short of holy ground. So take off your shoes and draw near. Together is where God is found."

This Lent, let us trust that God shows up in shades of gray, rainbow hues, and everywhere in between. Let us listen for God speaking even in, especially in, the midst of division, confusion, and the complexities of our life. Let us join together to experience a holy season of Lent that will draw us closer to God and to one another.


